Family of Innocent/Former Death-Sentenced Ohio Prisoner Kevin Keith to Deliver Petitions to Governor DeWine.

Columbus, OH - The brother and other family members of former death-sentenced prisoner Kevin Keith will lead a march to deliver thousands of petitions on Monday, urging Ohio Governor Mike DeWine to free Kevin Keith by Thanksgiving. Keith, whose death sentence was commuted by Former Ohio Governor Ted Strickland just 13 days before his scheduled execution in 2010, is the subject of a recently concluded [Spotify podcast by Kim Kardashian](#), exploring the complete lack of evidence against him and pointing to the likely killer, a protected police informant.

The public is invited to sign the petition at bit.ly/BringKevinHome and join the procession on Monday. Following a brief gathering starting at 12 PM on Monday, November 21st, on the sidewalk on the east side of the Ohio Capitol Building, the group will then march around the statehouse along Broad Street and High Street to the Riffe Tower sidewalk. At that point a small delegation will deliver the petitions to the Governor's office.

Leading the delivery will be Kevin Keith's brother, Charles Keith, who gathered enough evidence of doubt in his brothers' case to convince the Ohio Public Defender to more fully investigate, leading Governor Strickland to commute the death sentence. The Ohio Public Defender continued to discover even more evidence of Kevin's innocence, such that Governor Strickland now says he wishes he did more than simply commute the death sentence to Life Without Parole.

Despite all of this, no court has agreed to review the lack of evidence against Mr. Keith, a situation repeating itself with regularity across the country. These issues are spelled out in a motion seeking a clemency hearing submitted by Mr. Keith's attorneys to the Ohio Parole Board on August 15, 2022, and in Kim Kardashian's podcast, "The System," which is available free on Spotify.
